Pioneertown Motel was built along with the town to provide Hollywood stars and their crew a location to stay. Now it's an Old West encounter for guests searching for comfortable lodging. Guests will stay in one of the motel's 18 rooms which all have different Western themes and some rooms are equipped with kitchenettes. Wouldn't it be cool to sleep in the "John Wayne" room?

Every room has a different cowboy theme but all have an overall rustic feel. Expect a nice stay with friendly service from the owners. Don't expect to spend the night watching TV — there isn't one. Sit under the stars on your outdoor patio and enjoy the charm of this historic motel. Room rates are \$80 (plus tax) Sunday through Thursday. Weekends are \$100 (plus tax) and a one-night stay on either Friday or Saturday is slightly higher.
